

Minutes of the Presbytery of London

Burns Presbyterian Church, Mosa, Ontario, November 11, 2008, 7:00 p.m.

In Mosa, and within Burns Presbyterian Church, the Presbytery of London met in Regular Session on Tuesday, the eleventh day of November, two thousand and eight, at the hour of seven o'clock in the evening.

MOTION (Evans / Drozd) THAT the retirement of the Reverend Jim Redpath be accepted with the gratitude of the Presbytery for his service to Knox Church, Fingal, and to the Court during his tenure within the Presbytery of London. CARRIED.

MOTION (Evans / Drozd) THAT the members of Knox, Fingal be given permission to address the Court. CARRIED.

Mrs. Janice Lockhart, of Knox Presbyterian Church, Fingal, spoke to the Court, expressing sincere appreciation for the ministries of the Reverend Jim Redpath. Sabrina Caldwell, Kathy Fraser, and Keith McKee also expressed their appreciation to Jim for his time as a minister within the Presbytery.

MOTION (Evans / Drozd) THAT the pulpit of Knox Presbyterian Church, Fingal, be declared vacant effective February 1, 2009. CARRIED.

MOTION (Evans / Drozd) THAT an Exit Review Team to Knox, Fingal be named by the Vacancy and Visitation Committee. CARRIED.

MOTION (Evans / Drozd) THAT the Moderator appoint an Interim Moderator to Knox Presbyterian Church, Fingal, in consultation with the Exit Review Team. CARRIED.

Permission to Leave

The Moderator thanked the members of Knox Presbyterian Church, Fingal for their attendance, and invited them to remain for the balance of the meeting, but also gave them permission to leave if they so wished.

Trinity - West Elgin

The Interim Moderator for Trinity-West Elgin, the Reverend Johan Olivier presented his report on this Vacancy. The report noted that there is a serious situation developing in this charge following the amalgamation. A motion was passed at the Session Meeting of October 30, 2008 as follows: "*Moved by Bill Bradshaw and seconded by Brian Downie that Session make a request to Presbytery to hold a*

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“Presbytery Supervised” congregational meeting to address the future of Trinity Presbyterian Church, West Elgin, in light of the received petition.”

MOTION (Olivier / Jeffery) THAT the Moderator of Presbytery appoint a team from Presbytery to attend the congregational meeting at Trinity, West Elgin.
CARRIED.

The Interim Minister for Trinity, West Elgin, the Reverend John Van Vliet also presented his report on the situation at Trinity.

Comments were made by various members of the Court regarding this issue.

MOTION (Caldwell / Bannerman) THAT the petition be received. Following discussion the mover and seconder withdrew the motion.

The Reverend Andrew Reid spoke regarding this issue, and made the following **MOTION** (Reid / Baron) THAT the Presbytery direct the Session to return the current petition to the petitioners; THAT Presbytery declare that the concerns raised in the current petition have been fully addressed by the response to the Buchan petition; and THAT Presbytery reaffirm its support for the congregation of Trinity Presbyterian Church in pursuing the remainder of the course of action established at its meeting of April 13, 2008, specifically continue discussion on possible further amalgamation, close and sell the buildings, and continue its witness in its community.
CARRIED.

The congregation of Trinity, West Elgin was encouraged to seek to continue to worship as a community of faith.

Permission to Leave The Moderator thanked the members of Trinity Presbyterian Church, West Elgin for their attendance at the meeting, and were invited to remain, but also were given permission leave should they wish.

RECOMMENDATION #3 (Baron / Evans) THAT Bob Baron, Convenor, Carol Rayner, Treasurer, and one other person to be named by the Moderator, form the Presbyterians Sharing Committee. CARRIED.

MOTION: (Jeffery / M. Marshall) THAT the Session Records of Glencoe Presbyterian Church be attested as neatly and correctly kept. CARRIED.

MOTION: (Jeffery / M. Marshall) THAT the Session Records of St. John's Presbyterian Church, Wardsville be attested as neatly and correctly kept, with the following notes: S.27.2, 27.4, 27.5, 27.6, 27.8, 27.11. CARRIED.

The Moderator thanked Rob and Tom for their work in examining these Session Records.

Students and Education Team Sabrina Caldwell presented the report of the Students and Education Team, and discussed the history of the Dr. Stalker Fund. She specifically read three motions which were passed at the meeting of the Presbytery of London at its meeting of November 8, 1983, which constitute the guidelines for the use of the Stalker Fund. These motions are reproduced here:

- 1. That students under the care of the Presbytery of London attending one of the colleges of the Presbyterian Church in Canada or other institutions approved by the General Assembly be given first consideration for aid from this fund on the basis of financial need.*
- 2. That in order to somewhat protect the value of the Fund from inflation, disbursements in a given year shall not ordinarily exceed 80% of the interest received in the previous year.*
- 3. That in years when the needs of students from this Presbytery have not exhausted the annual disbursement, the Presbytery should entertain bursary applications channelled through the offices of the colleges of the Presbyterian Church in Canada, these bursaries also to be awarded on the basis of need.*

What these motions do not cover is what happens to the available interest that is not used in a given year; therefore we make the following:

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RECOMMENDATION #1 (Caldwell / Dolbear-Van Bilsen) THAT any available interest not fully disbursed within a given calendar year be accrued for disbursement at a later date within the terms of the Presbytery guidelines and that this be retroactive to January 1, 2006. CARRIED.

RECOMMENDATION #2 (Caldwell / Dolbear-Van Bilsen) THAT the above motion be added to the three motions passed in 1983 as point #4 and that all four motions appear together in the Presbytery minutes of the November 22, 2008 meeting, and that a copy of this entire report (to the end of the next recommendation) be kept on file by the Clerk and the Convenor of the Students and Education Team for future reference. CARRIED.

Stalker Fund Request

We have had a request from only one student for support from the Stalker Fund. The Stalker Fund was not drawn upon last year, and so we have a total of \$4,478.00 accumulated in interest (\$2710 in 2006 and \$2887 in 2007).

RECOMMENDATION #3 (Caldwell / Dolbear-Van Bilsen) THAT John Park be given a grant of \$3500 from the Stalker Fund. CARRIED.

Robert Wilson Sabrina also informed the Court that Mr. Robert Wilson had been interviewed this afternoon by some representatives of Presbytery. A follow-up interview will be held on December 18, 2008.

Vacancy and Visitation Team The Report of the Visitation Team to New St. James was presented by John Bannerman, who indicated that the visitation was positive and encouraging. **MOTION** (Jeffery / Bannerman) THAT the Visitation Team to New St. James Presbyterian Church be dismissed with the thanks of the Court. CARRIED.

RECOMMENDATION #2 (Reid / Drozd) THAT the resignation of the Reverend Dr. Robert Robinson as Interim Minister at Knox Presbyterian Church, St. Thomas, be accepted, effective December 31, 2008, in terms of the Interim Ministry covenant, with the thanks of the Court. CARRIED.

RECOMMENDATION #3 (Reid / Drozd) THAT the Moderator of Presbytery be given power to appoint an Interim Moderator to Knox Presbyterian Church, St. Thomas, effective January 1, 2009. CARRIED.

RECOMMENDATION #4 (Reid / Drozd) THAT the Moderator of Presbytery be given power to name a Team to conduct exit interviews with Mrs. Elder and Dr. Robinson, and any other groups or individuals whom the Team deems necessary to consult, and report to the January, 2009 meeting of Presbytery.

AMENDMENT: (Bannerman / Fraser) THAT the Advisory Committee be named to conduct the Exit Interviews. CARRIED.

MOTION as AMENDED: THAT the Moderator of Presbytery name the Advisory Committee to conduct exit interviews with Mrs. Elder and Dr. Robinson, and any other groups or individuals whom the Team deems necessary to consult, and report to the January, 2009 meeting of Presbytery. CARRIED.

Rodney / Kintyre / New Glasgow - "Trinity - West Elgin" - Report presented earlier.

St. Lawrence, London - Lynn Nichol reported that this congregation is carrying on, that a contract for pulpit supply and pastoral care is in place, and that the search for a new minister continues. She shared that the pews have now been replaced with more comfortable seating, and that the floors have been refinished, and the parking lot has been paved.

Mrs. Nichol then indicated that she has served for three years as Interim Moderator to St. Lawrence, and feels that it is time for her to resign this position effective January 31, 2009.

MOTION: (Redpath / Bannerman) THAT the resignation of the Reverend Lynn Nichol as Interim Moderator to St. Lawrence Presbyterian Church, London, be accepted effective January 31, 2009 with the thanks of the Court. CARRIED.

MOTION: (Evans / Baron) THAT the Moderator appoint an Interim Moderator to St. Lawrence Presbyterian Church, London effective February 1, 2009. CARRIED.

St. James, North Yarmouth - John Bannerman reported diligence, and indicated that the Elders are working hard on the profile. Pulpit Supply is in place. He also reported that there is probably good news in the sale of the Knox, Belmont building, but this has not been finalized as yet.

Knox, St. Thomas - no report

Burns, Mosa - Kathy Fraser reported that she is enjoying working with this congregation. The session is dedicated, and the Search Committee has been named, and profiles are starting to be received. Pulpit Supply is in place and pastoral care is being provided.

Argyle-Crinan / Duff-Largie - Deb Dolbear-Van Bilsen reported that things are moving along in this charge, the Sessions have met, the Pulpit is being supplied, and these congregations are planning to start using the PAR plan for offerings.
